NARRATIVE

On 03/10/04 I was assigned to apply for and obtain a search warrant for #353085 the ERICKSON residence located at 3706 Chinkapin Court in southwest Columbia, MO. At about 2:11 PM Judge Oxenhandler, Division II, Circuit Court, Boone County authorized the search warrant.

At about 8:40 PM I was assigned to lead a team of detectives in the service of that search warrant. We arrived at the target address and made contact with three family members of the ERICKSON household. We were admitted into the residence, and I served the search warrant. The team consisted of myself, Detectives Barbara Buck, Latisha Stroer, Mike Maynard, and Tim Giger. Detective Giger photographed the scene. Detective Maynard collected what evidence was removed from the residence. During a search of the residence we were directed by family members to a room in the lower part of the residence. The room was identified by family members, and by contents as belonging to one of the two suspects in this case identified as Charles Timothy ERICKSON.



Three items were removed from the ERICKSON residence. All three were removed from the bedroom being that of Charles ERICKSON, and include two (2) marijuana smoking devices, particularly a glass marijuana bong and a small marijuana pipe, and a small amount of marijuana believed to be less than 35 grams were recovered from the bedroom. These items were collected by Detective Maynard and removed from the residence. During our service of the search warrant, members of the ERICKSON household were polite, cooperative and helpful → We were not able to locate any items that we recognized as being associated with this homicide investigation.

The search warrant service and return was returned to the court on Thursday, 03/11/04.
